Why Mental Health First Aid?

Mental Health First Aid teaches you **how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders**. In this 8-hour course, participants learn the unique risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems, the importance of early intervention and, most importantly, how to help someone experiencing a mental health or substance use emergency.

WHAT IT COVERS

- Signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose.
- Step-by-step instructions on how to respond to an opioid overdose, including how to administer naloxone.
- The context and statistics for opioid use and misuse.
- A discussion of concerns surrounding the opioid response steps.

The course will teach you how to apply the ALGEE action plan:

- **Assess** for risk of suicide or harm
- **Listen** nonjudgmentally
- **Give** reassurance and information
- **Encourage** appropriate professional help
- **Encourage** self-help and other support strategies
